Effective March 1, 2011, for dressage: Anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear except those riders age 17 and over while on horses that are competing *only* in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above (including FEI Young Rider Tests, the USEF Developing Prix St. Georges Test, and USEF Bretina Cup Test). Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The headgear and harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.

All regular classes: 1st - 6th place ribbons. Prizes for 1st place
Overall High Score Adult Amateur any class: ribbon and prize
Overall High Score Jr/Yr any class: medal

SWVADA Series Awards

With entry into two out of three SWVADA shows for the year, competitors will qualify for one of our Series Awards, given in the following categories:

- High Point Adult Amateur (Intro Level)
- High Point Adult Amateur (Training Level)
- High Point Adult Amateur (First Level and above)
- High Point Junior/Young Rider (Intro Level)
- High Point Junior/Young Rider (Training Level)
- High Point Junior/Young Rider (First Level and above)

*Please note that "Junior/Young Rider" qualifies as any rider age twenty-one or below

Intro Level (Tests A, B, and C)

As specified by USDF; may be ridden in the small arena (20 x 40 meters)

Junior TOC (21 yrs and younger)

Junior riders may ride one test of choice for free if entered in at least one other dressage test.

Training Level Tests 1-3

As specified by USEF

First Level Tests 1-3

As specified by USEF

Second Level Tests 1-3

As specified by USEF

Third Level & above TOC

Third level and above test of choice as specified by USEF

Musical Freestyle Test of Choice (MFS TOC)

Freestyle Test of Choice for Training Level and above. Music must be submitted to the show management no less than 2 hours prior to ride time, **on a CD that plays on an audio device, not a computer (different disc). Music on cell phones or thumb drives cannot be used!** Indicate level on entry form.

Dressage Equitation

Open to all riders. The size of the class shall not be more than 15 riders and if entries warrant, class may be split. Horses are shown at medium walk, working trot, and canter in both directions of the ring. Movements shall be performed by the exhibitors simultaneously. The judge, however, may ask for independent execution of certain movements. The rider's position, seat, and, specifically, correct use and effects of the aids required by the Training and First Level Dressage tests are to be judged. No change of horses. Whips/spurs allowed. To be shown in plain snaffle.

Dressage Suitability

Open to horses that have not competed in any test above First Level and that are under 7 years of age. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter in both directions of the ring. To be judged on the horse's potential to become a dressage mount.

Leadline: See test on swvada.org under resources. At end child may be asked simple questions by judge: color of mount, touch withers, neck, shoulders etc.

For children 8 years of age and under being led on a horse or pony. Ribbons to all.

Combined Training Test of Choice (CT TOC)

Combined training test of choice BN-Advanced; Tests A & B as specified by USEA

Western Dressage Intro Level (Tests 1-4)

Western Dressage Basic (Tests 1-4)

Western Dressage Level 1 (Tests 1-4)

Prix Caprilli Test 1

Walk trot only; fence height not to exceed 18"

Prix Caprilli Test 2 (Training, 2')

For horses who have shown Training level or above; fence height not to exceed 2'

Prix Caprilli Test 3

For horses who have shown First Level or above; fence height not to exceed 2'6"

Other Information:

- **Ride Times** will be posted on the SWVADA website on or before the Thursday evening prior to the show
- Mail entry to show secretary listed on entry form by closing date to avoid late fee
- Indicate test level (name and number)
- Junior riders (21 and under) may ride one test free with paid entry of at least one other test
- **Make all checks payable to SWVADA**
- Include negative Coggins test dated within 12 months of show date
- Classes will be divided into Junior/Senior if entries warrant
- **Please contact the show manager before the closing date for volunteer opportunities**
- All dogs must be leashed. Owners of impounded dogs will be fined \$35.
- No horses will be admitted to the show facility without a negative Coggins test
- Refund policy: No refund after closing date for any reason. Full refund, minus office fee, if before closing date, any reason. Full refund if show is cancelled or rescheduled and competitor can't make new date.
